<b>26 / 16 Welcome / Apologies for Absence</b>	The Chair welcomed everyone to the meeting. Apologies had been received from Councillor J Sanderson.	
<b>26 / 17 Declarations of Business Interests</b>	There were no declarations of business interests / dispensations.	
<b>26 / 18 Minutes</b>	The minutes of the meeting held on Wednesday 28 January 2026 had been circulated prior to the meeting.  <b>Resolved: The minutes of the previous meeting be agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chair.</b>	
<b>26 / 19 Matters Arising</b>	<b>Shared: The Action Tracker:</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>Park Signage</b> – work in progress.</li> <li>➤ <b>Hedge-cutting</b> – Snicket has been cut with other hedges to be checked.</li> <li>➤ <b>Weed Killer</b> – Funding received from NYC Locality Budget – subject to weather conditions.</li> <li>➤ <b>Litterbin Replacement</b> – The litterbin has not yet been resolved.</li> <li>➤ <b>Snicket Report</b> – Quotation received – Synergy Outdoors to be instructed to do the work.</li> <li>➤ <b>Tree Inspection</b> – Tree report received and subject to funding available.</li> <li>➤ <b>Community Resilience Plan</b> – Second draft of the CRP circulated to Councillors for their consideration. The Clerk asked for comments before the end of April.</li> <li>➤ <b>Wording for Call for Sites Consultation</b> – wording has been received from NYC.</li> <li>➤ <b>Highways</b> – Work on the cobbles discussed. The Parish Council would need permission from North Yorkshire Council to work on the highway. At this point in the meeting North Yorkshire Councillor Wilkinson and Jayne Charlton (Highways) talked to the meeting about speeding and highways issues within the Parish. It was noted that</li> </ul>	

	<p>following information received the average speed over a period was 29.9 mph. One of the issues is around the amount of traffic going through the Village. There was no funding available for any major works to help alleviate the issues. It was suggested that the Parish Council contacts the North Yorkshire Community Safety Hub and look at planning for the future. Regarding the school visibility on exiting the car park, the Highways Authority had informed the school that the onus is on them to resolve the issue with an idea of swapping the entrance and exit for the school. Highways will write to the school regarding this issue. The Yorkshire Water works were explained at this point.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ <b>FAQ</b> – Consideration to be given to informing parishioners of work undertaken so far to contact other agencies.</li> <li>➤ <b>Community Survey</b> – Community Survey had been circulated and deadline had passed.</li> <li>➤ <b>Park Signage</b> – No dog signs had been erected.</li> <li>➤ <b>Park Maintenance</b> – The Willow Tunnel had been cut. Steps on the zip wire had been slippery, but it was felt this was due to the damp weather.</li> <li>➤ <b>Community Events</b> – The FEC had written to other groups, businesses, and clubs to see if there was an appetite to do a weekend community festival. The FEC had also written to groups, businesses, and clubs to share the new community calendar and had been embedded on the PC website with clear disclaimer.</li> </ul>	
<b>26 / 20 Public Forum</b>	<p><b>Allotments</b> It was noted that Local Councils have a statutory duty under the Small Holdings and Allotments Act 1908 (Section 23) to provide sufficient allotments if it believes there is a demand. If six or more registered electors request allotments, the Council must consider it. Councils can buy or lease land if it decides to do so. Councils must use its best endeavours to acquire suitable land.</p> <p><b>Public Footpath / Styles</b> It was noted that there is an issue with one of the styles near the bridge. The Clerk to report this to the NYC Public Footpaths Officers.</p>	
<b>26 / 21 Clerk's Report</b>	<p><b>Annual Parish Meeting (as opposed to the Annual Meeting of the Parish Council)</b> The Clerk explained the difference in the two meetings stating that Morton on Swale would need to organise an Annual Parish Meeting officiated by the Chair and Clerk only. This meeting is a mandatory community-focused meeting held between 1 March and 1 June each year. It enables residents to hear reports on the past year's activities, ask questions and suggest ideas to their Parish Council.</p> <p><b>Resolved: That the Annual Parish Meeting would take place at 6.30 pm on Wednesday 27 May 2026 prior to the Parish Council meeting at 7.30 pm.</b></p>
